Summary Report on Public Awareness Programme

Objective of the Programme

The aim of the programme was to raise awareness among villagers about health and hygiene, government welfare schemes, and sustainable energy sources, while also conducting a home-to-home survey to assess their needs and concerns.

#### Activities Conducted

- 1. Health and Hygiene Awareness:
  - Organized workshops on personal hygiene, sanitation, and disease prevention.
  - Demonstrated practices like handwashing and safe drinking water.
- 2. Government Schemes Awareness:
  - Provided information on key government initiatives like Ayushman Bharat, MGNREGA, and financial schemes for rural areas.
  - Assisted villagers in understanding how to access these schemes and register for benefits.

#### 3. Energy Sources Awareness:

- Educated villagers about renewable energy options such as solar energy and its benefits.
- Explained energy conservation methods to reduce electricity consumption.
- 4. Home-to-Home Survey:
  - Conducted a survey to identify the community's knowledge gaps regarding health, hygiene, and government schemes.
  - Gathered data on the villagers' access to basic sanitation and energy sources.



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Impact and Outcomes

- The awareness sessions reached over 58 houses in a village, and many expressed an interest in applying for government welfare schemes.
- Villagers showed a positive response towards adopting better hygiene practices and exploring solar energy solutions.
- The survey revealed key areas for future intervention, including the installation of sanitation facilities and increased access to healthcare schemes.

#### Challenges

- Limited resources restricted the scope of some activities.
- Some villagers were initially hesitant to participate due to lack of awareness.

#### Conclusion

The programme successfully achieved its goal of educating villagers on essential health practices, available government schemes, and sustainable energy sources. The home-to-home survey also provided valuable insights for further community support and engagement.

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#### Event Summary – Health Checkup Camp for Women Organized at Rajgad Dnyanpeeth's Technical Campus

A Health Checkup Camp for Women was organized by Rajgad Dnyanpeeth's Technical Campus Polytechnic on 11/03/2025The event aimed to provide free health checkups and raise awareness about women's health issues. Each participant was provided with a registration form, and they were guided to different health stations for a thorough checkup. # REPORT ON Unnat Maharashtra Abhiyan"



Unnat Maharashtra Abhiyan (UMA) is a project of the Ministry of Higher and Technical Education. Its mandate is to build an independent and public knowledge infrastructure for the state of Maharashtra which will bring socio-economic and cultural development for its people, especially those in the bottom 80% of the socio-economic strata. UMA aligns closely with the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) mechanism of the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, whose vision is to bring about "transformational change in rural development processes by leveraging knowledge institutions to help build the architecture of an Inclusive India"

RDTCPOLY UMA conducted the **Village surveys** and **Baseline household surveys** for all the **1** villages in its fold in **70** households. These surveys were done by a team of **50** students from RDTCPOLY department and 3 faculty members using the standard questionnaires specified by UMA (See Annexures). It was done in a planned manner with formation of several teams who were allocated different areas for survey. **1** villages were divided into **2** clusters and surveys were organized for these one clusters on same day.
